in creating this book, i've tried to give you lots of choices. after all, it is your quilt, and you're going to want ideas to make your quilt unique & very special.

so here they are — fresh designs and new ideas for you. use them freely, change them to suit your projects, and - above all - have fun!

I wrote those words over 20 years ago, and they're still true: I want you to have fun with these designs!

As I scanned a 1983 copy of this book in its original format, I was amazed at how much things have changed... and how little.

When I wrote "Fresh Designs", I drew all of the pictures by hand. The dotted lines were freehand, and the text was my own handwriting, sometimes written with guidelines... and sometimes not. Today, I'd probably create the graphics on my computer, and they'd be far more perfect and precise.

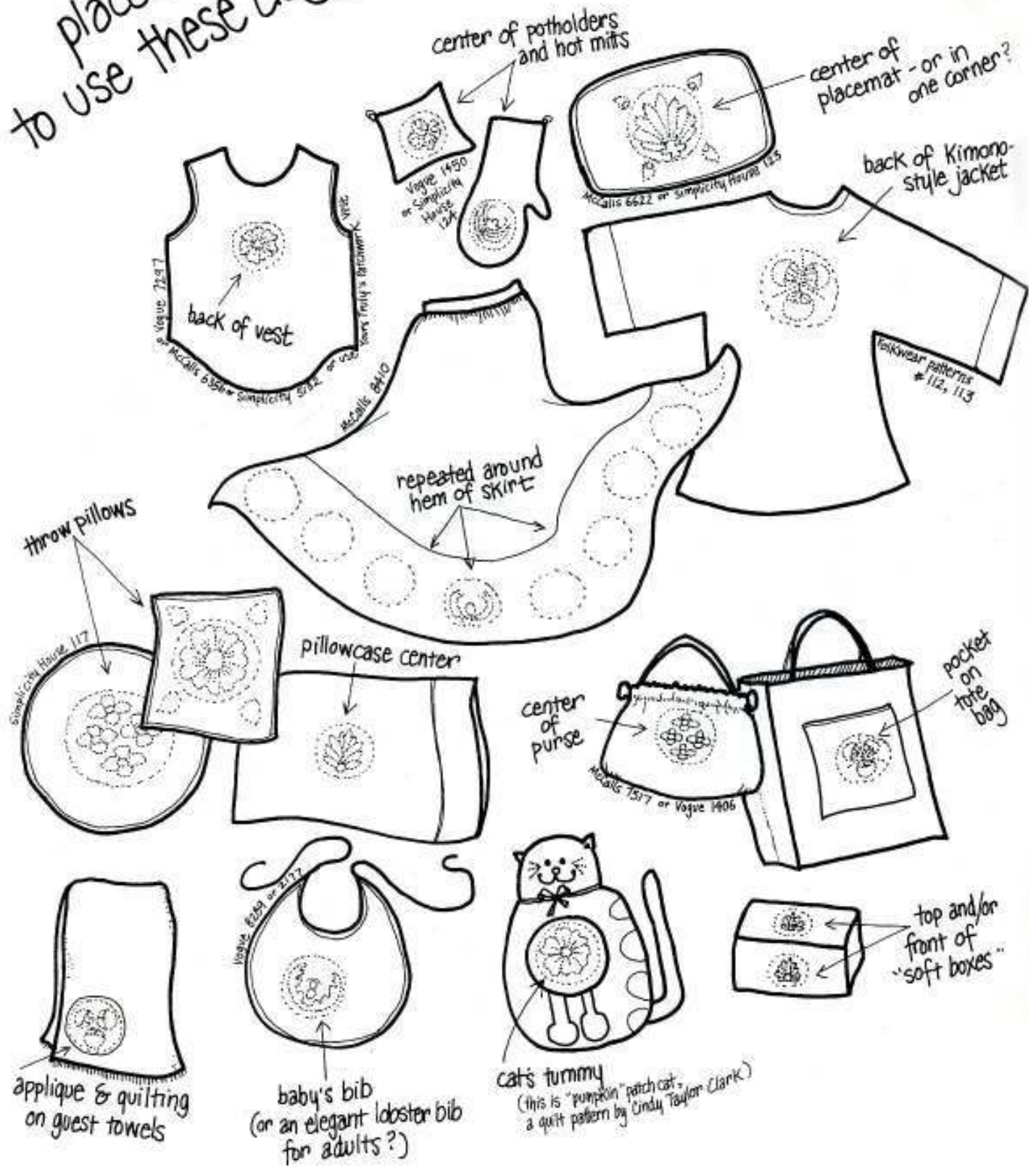
Would that detract from their charm? I'm not sure. The energy would certainly be different.

I believe that these designs are still useful today, for the same kinds of projects that I outlined on pages two and three, in addition to their use with quilts.

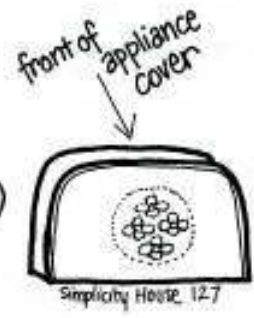
As I said in the early 1980s, have fun with these designs! (See the last page for copyright info.)

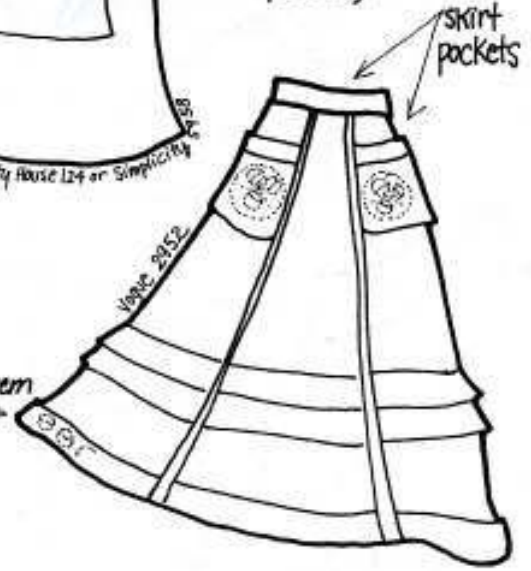

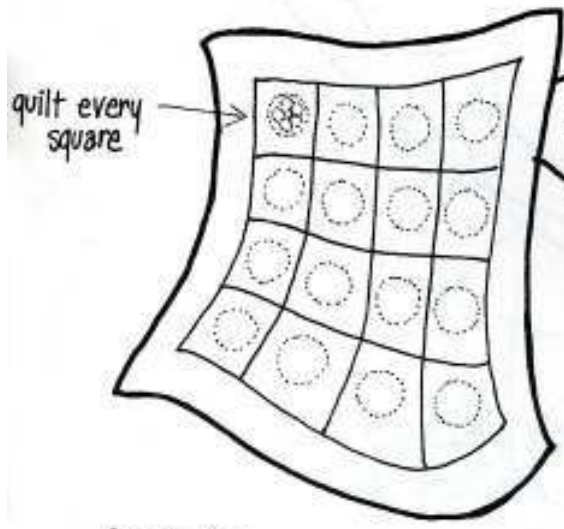

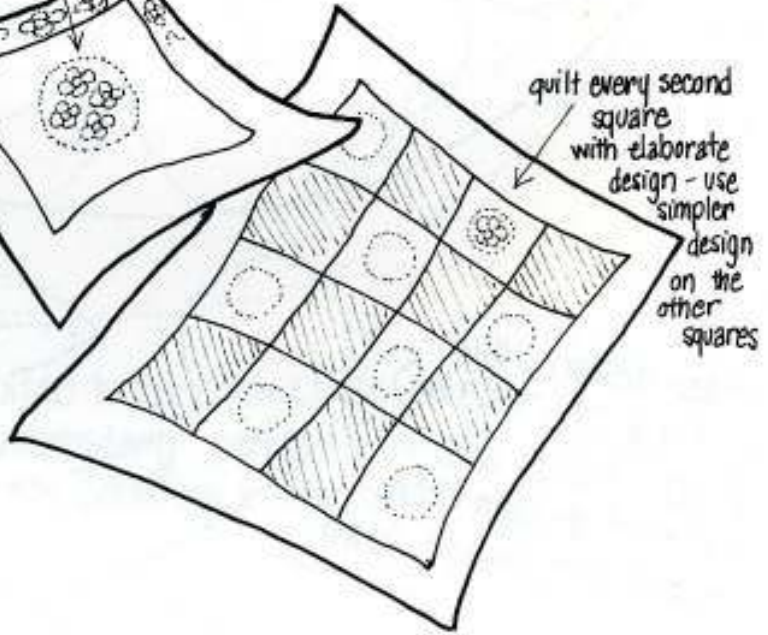
front of apron (or perhaps on the pocket?)

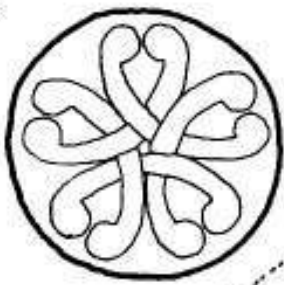


quilt center, medallion style, and quilt border (baby quilt)

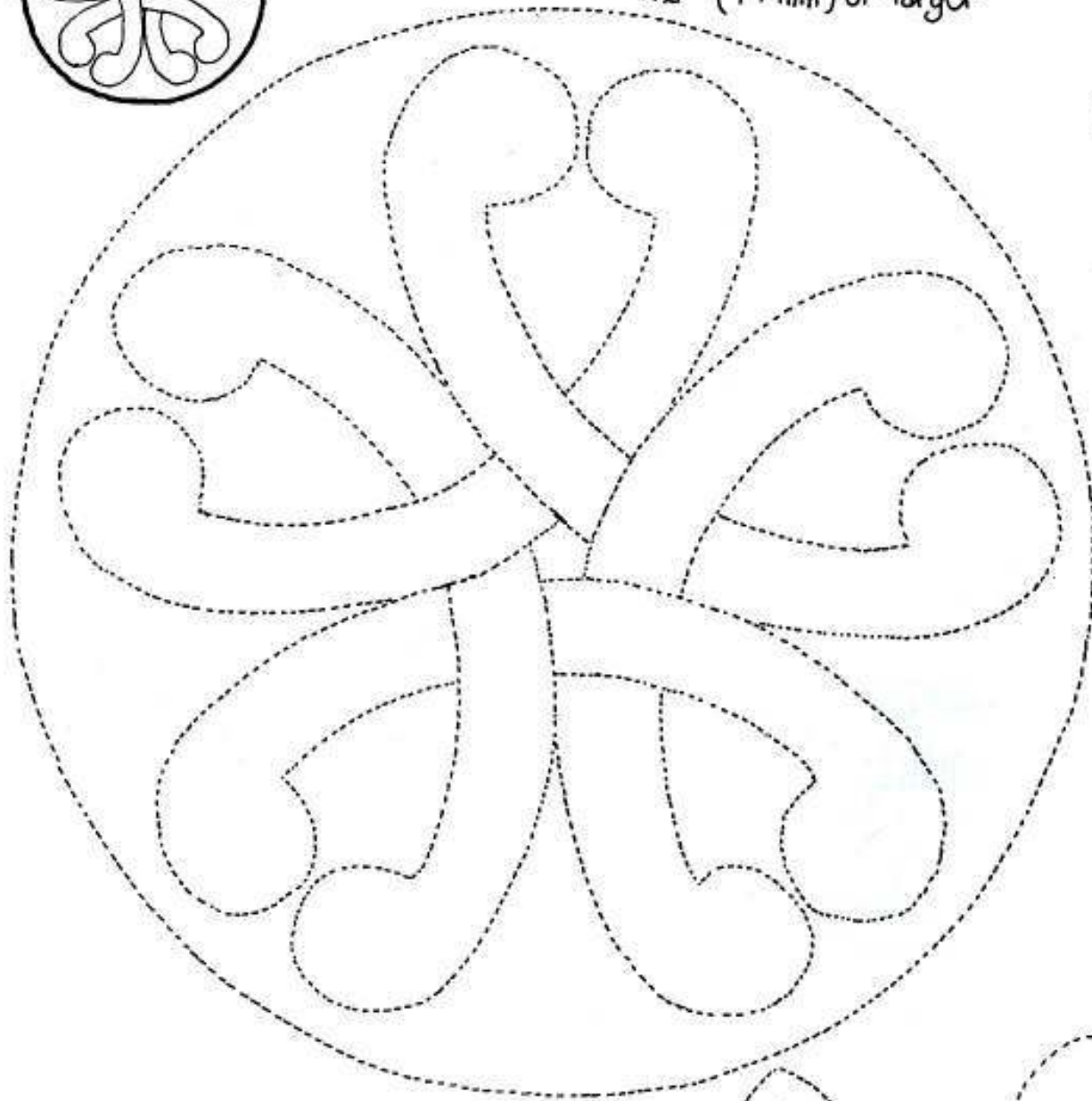

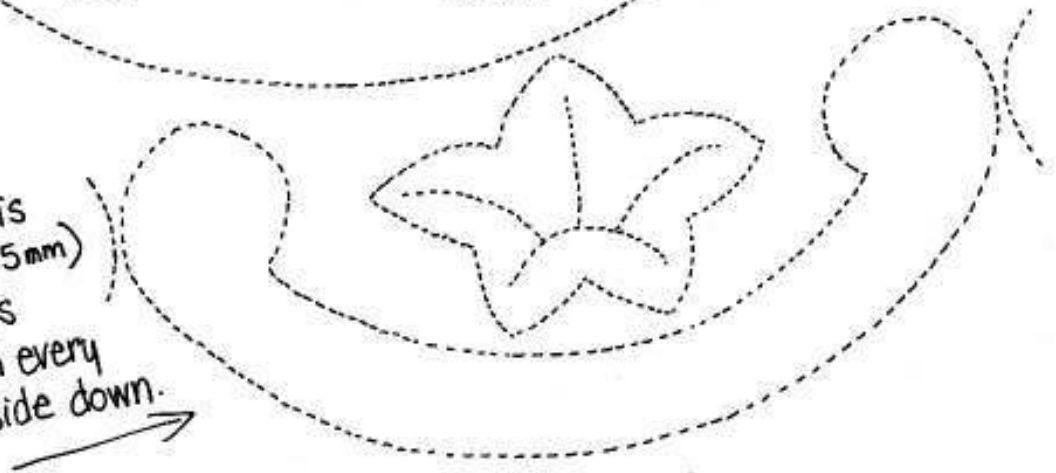


scroll design - this design fits blocks
7 1/2" (19 mm) or larger



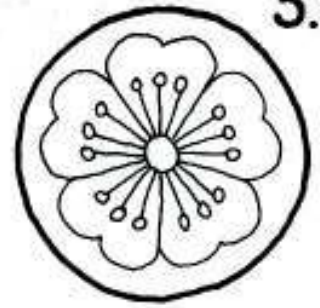
crewel idea - use gold or other metallic thread on a black, red, blue,

second one upside down.

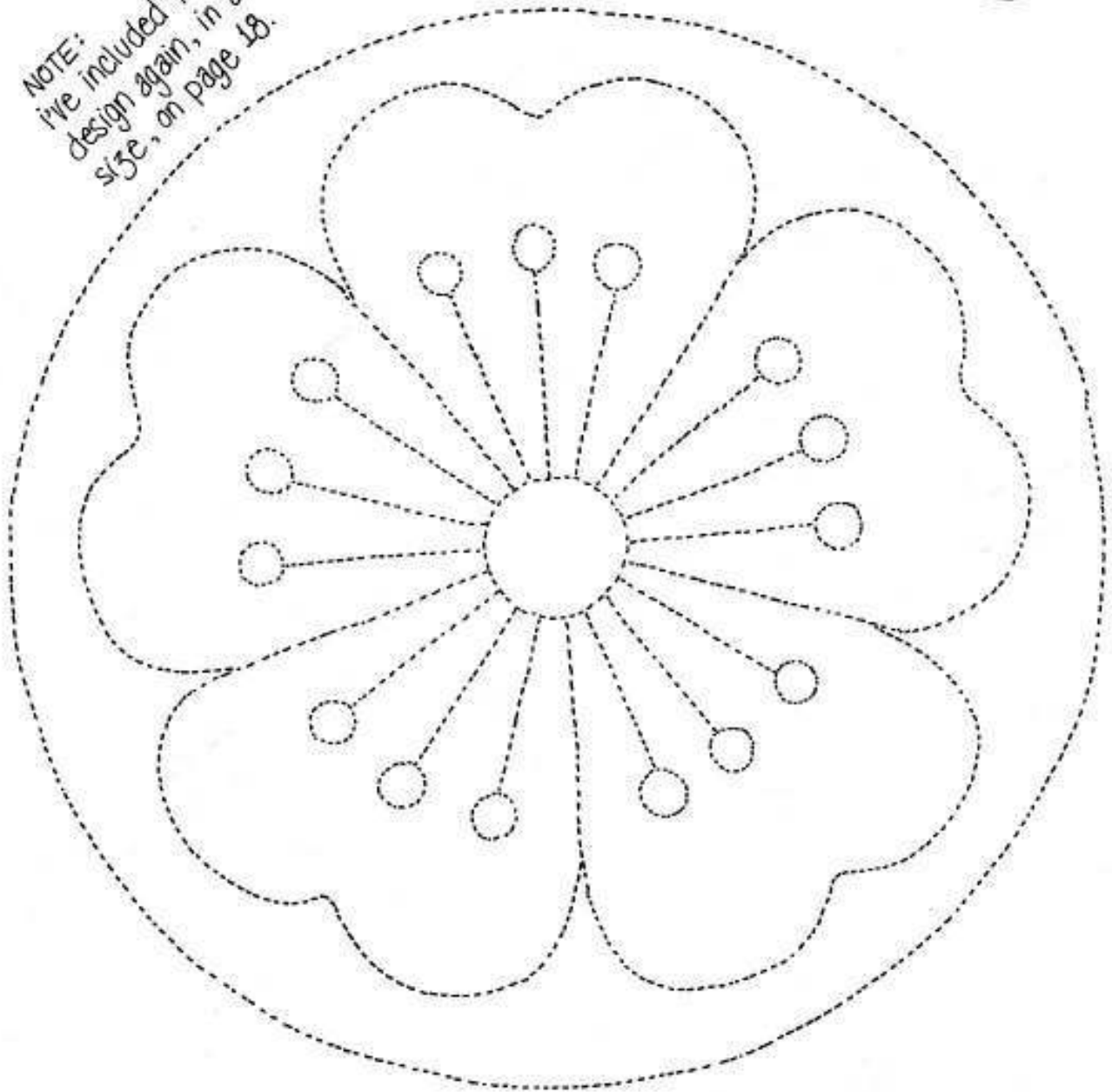

7½" (19 mm) or larger

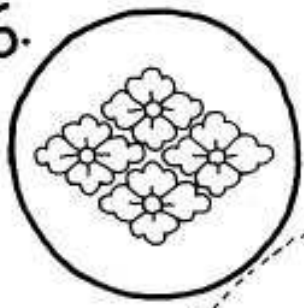

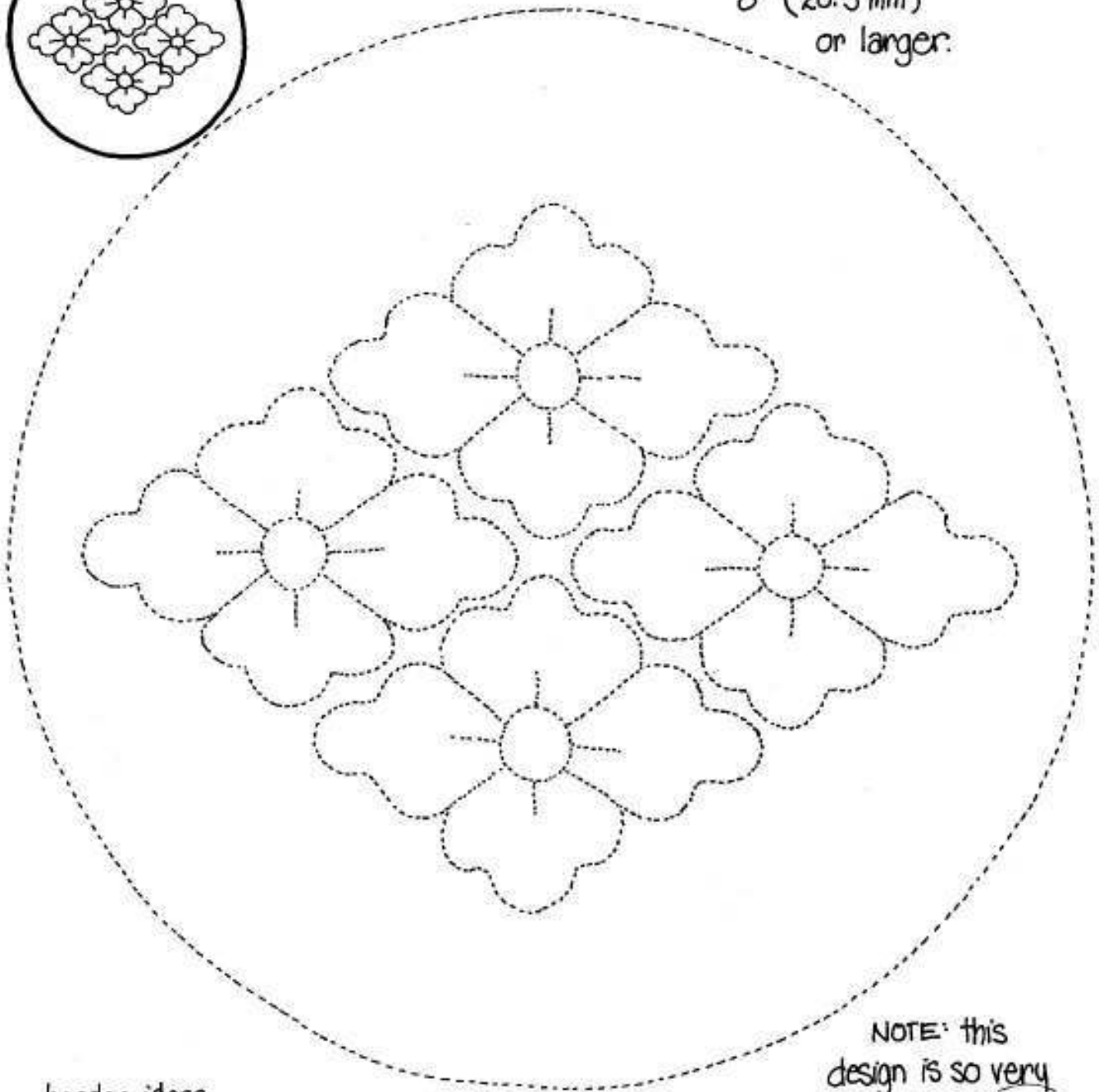


this design is especially well suited to candlewicking, or a combination of applique & embroidery. perhaps a bright orange applique for the petals, with the detailing in black embroidery?

or larger.

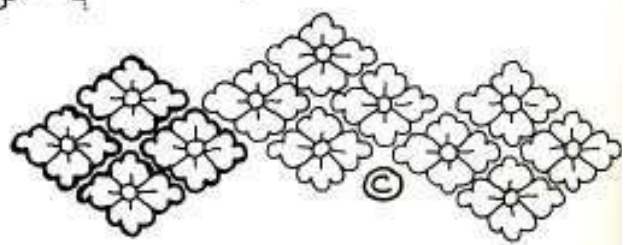
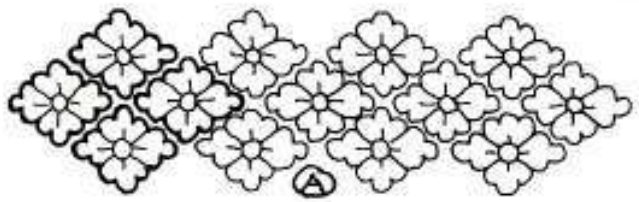


border ideas -

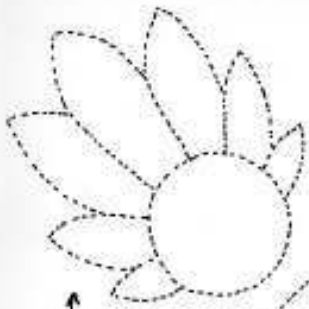
- Ⓐ repeat, with an overlap in the design

- Ⓒ repeat, staggered



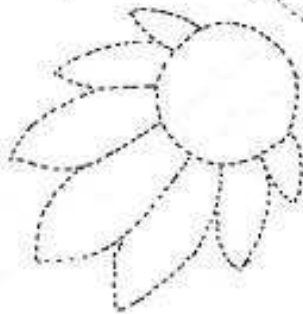
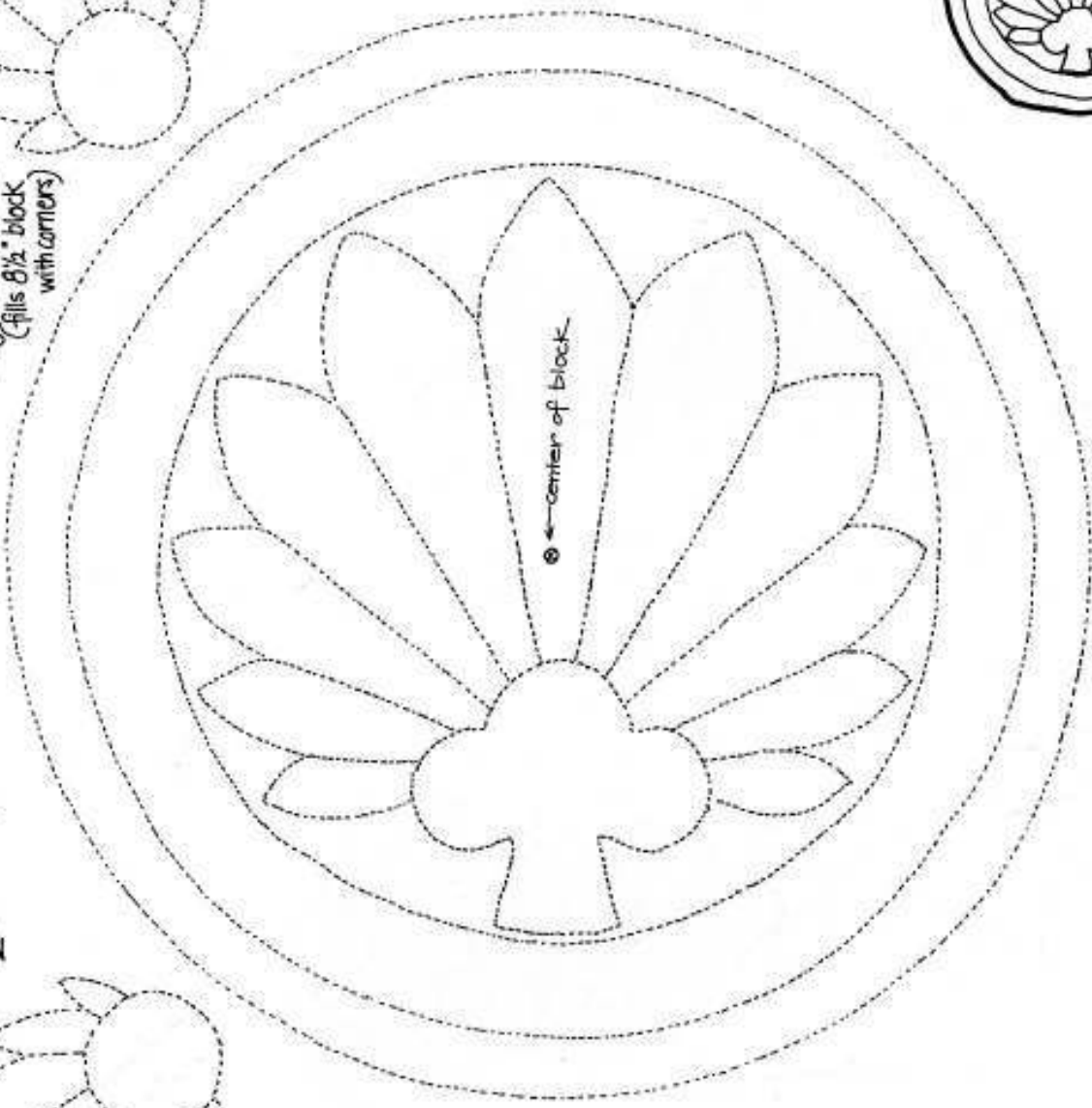
NOTE: this design is so very versatile that i've included it in other sizes on pages 16 & 18.



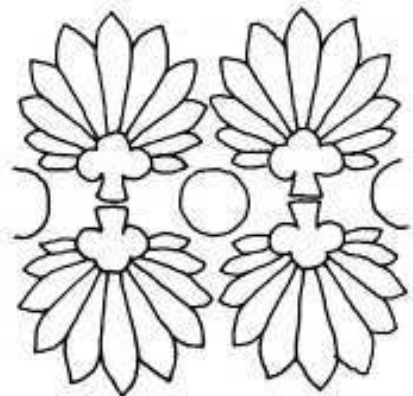
umbrella fan design - this design fills
6 1/2" (16.5 mm)



optional corners for square or rectangular blocks →
(fills 8 1/2" block with corners)



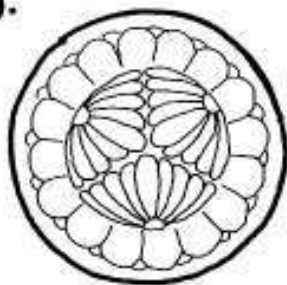
repeated, this design fills
a 9 1/2" (24 mm) border



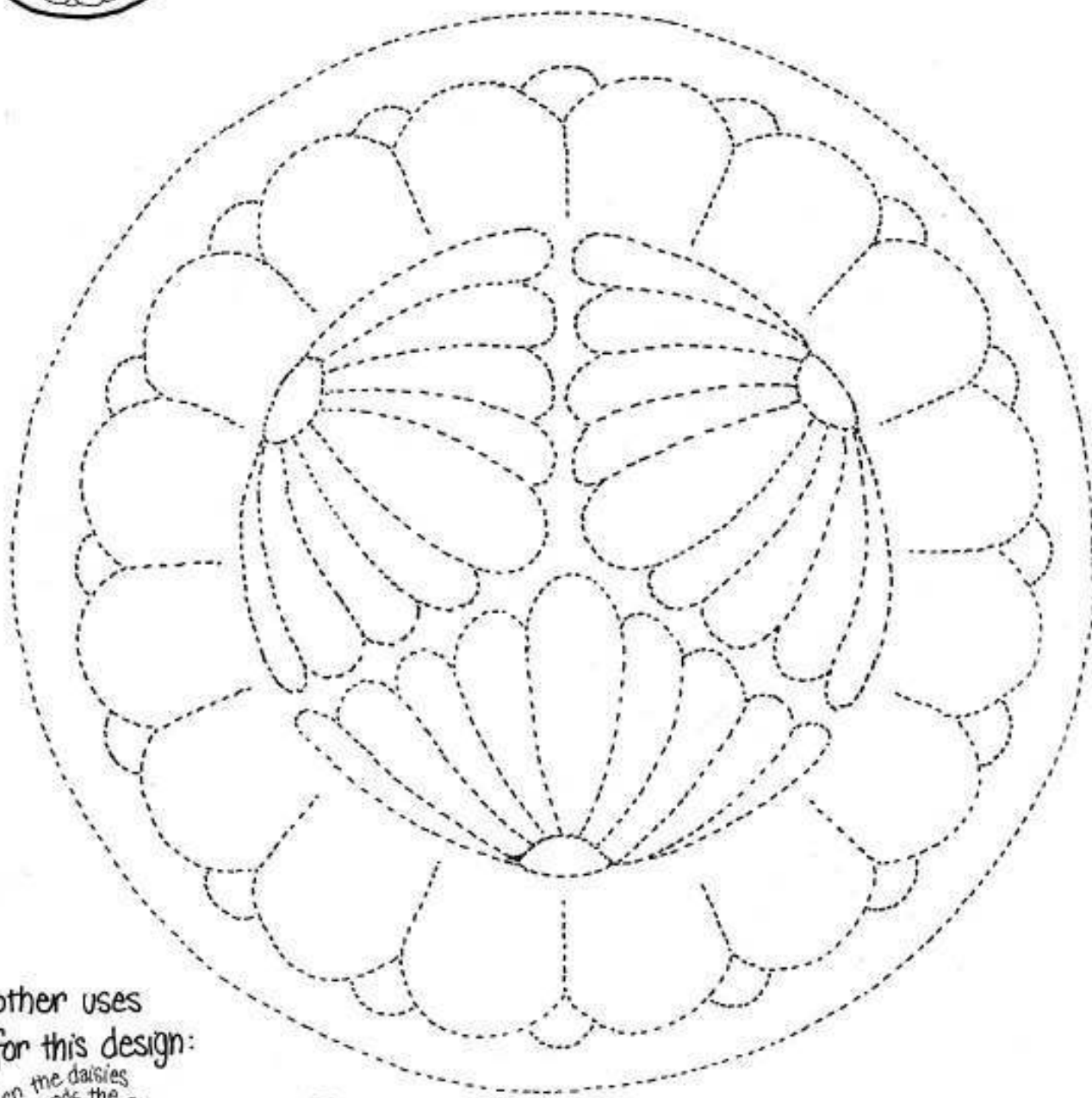
repeated this way, it will fill a 4 3/4" (12 mm) border

three daisies - this design is for blocks that are $7\frac{3}{4}$ " (19.5 mm) or larger



other uses for this design:

turn the daisies towards the center!



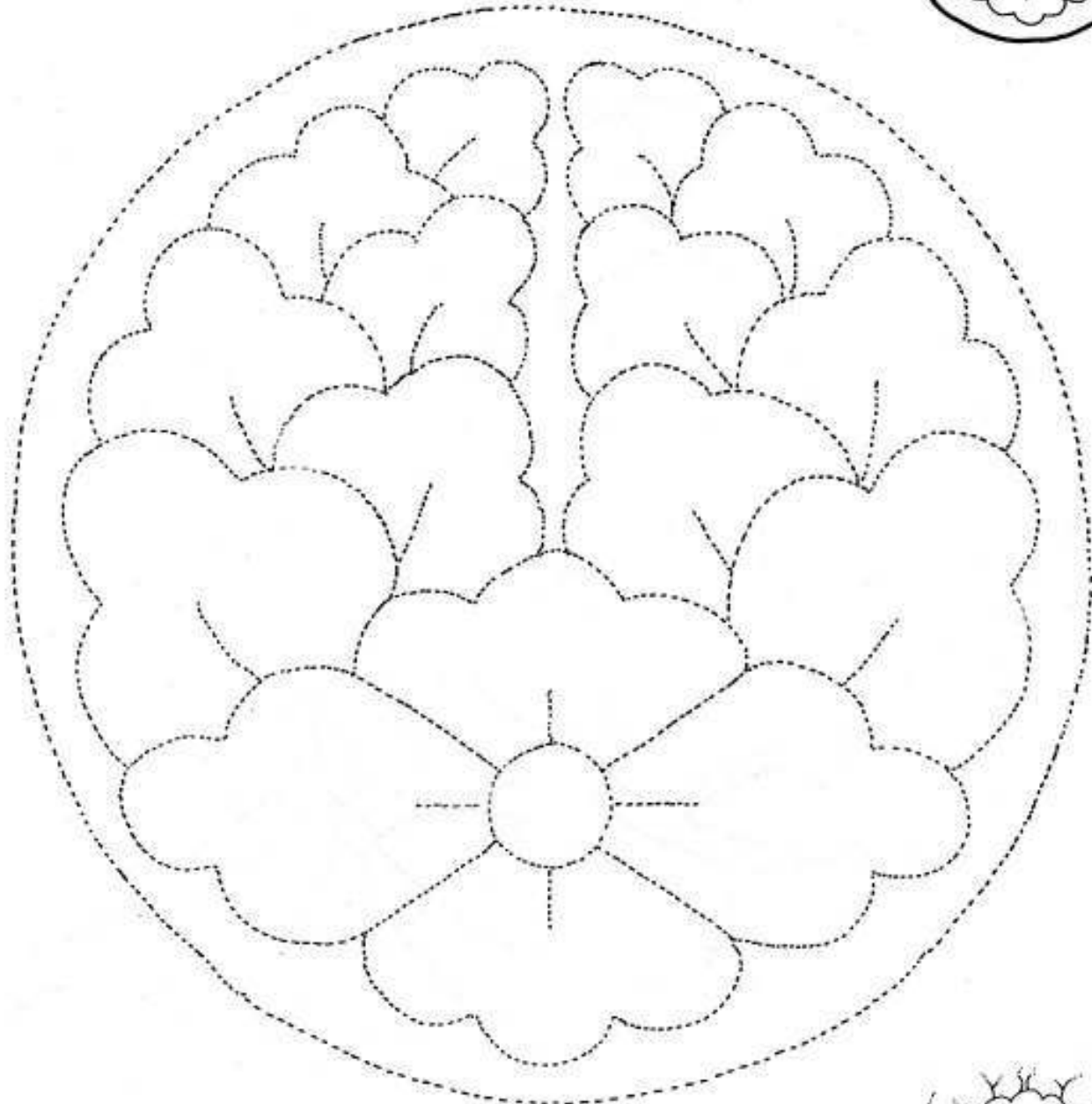
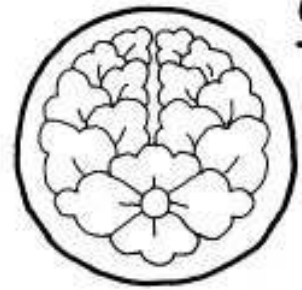
this is a full size circle for this design's center

border design - makes a $2\frac{1}{4}$ " (5.5 mm) border



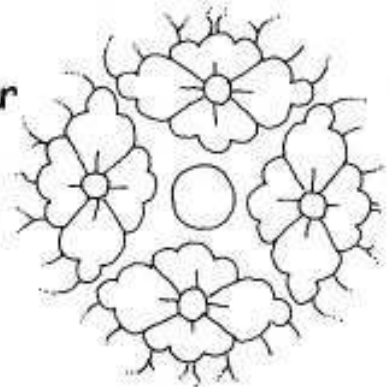

floral wreath - this is for blocks $7\frac{1}{2}$ "
(19 mm) or larger



this design is good for candlewicking or embroidery, too. the center flower could be the darkest (perhaps dark pink, blue, or purple), and the other flowers could be progressively lighter in color.

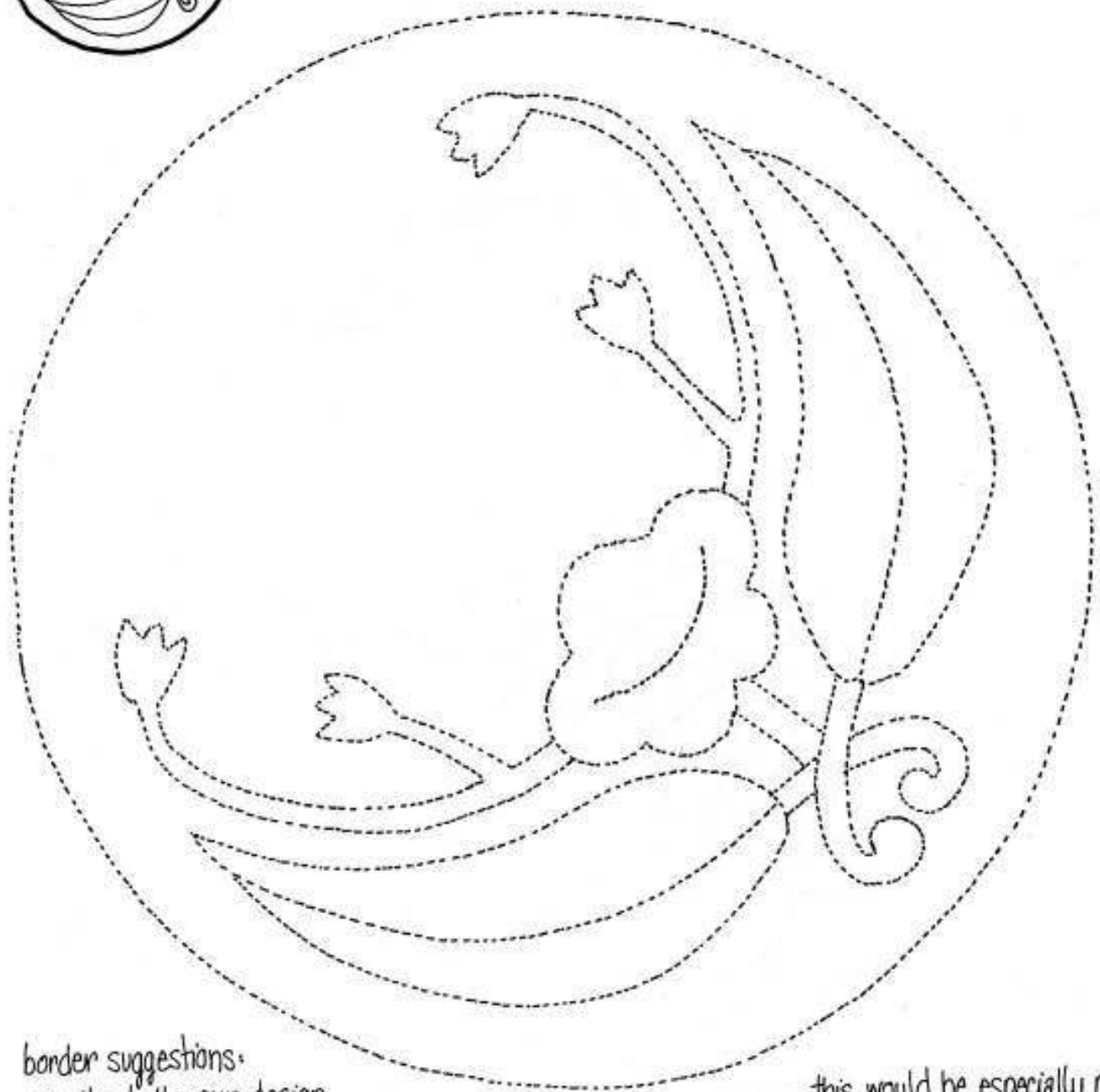
for a medallion effect, repeat the design 4 times, in a circle, with the large flowers towards the center.

buttercups - this design is for blocks 8" (20 mm) or larger



border suggestions:
use the buttercup design
on page 16



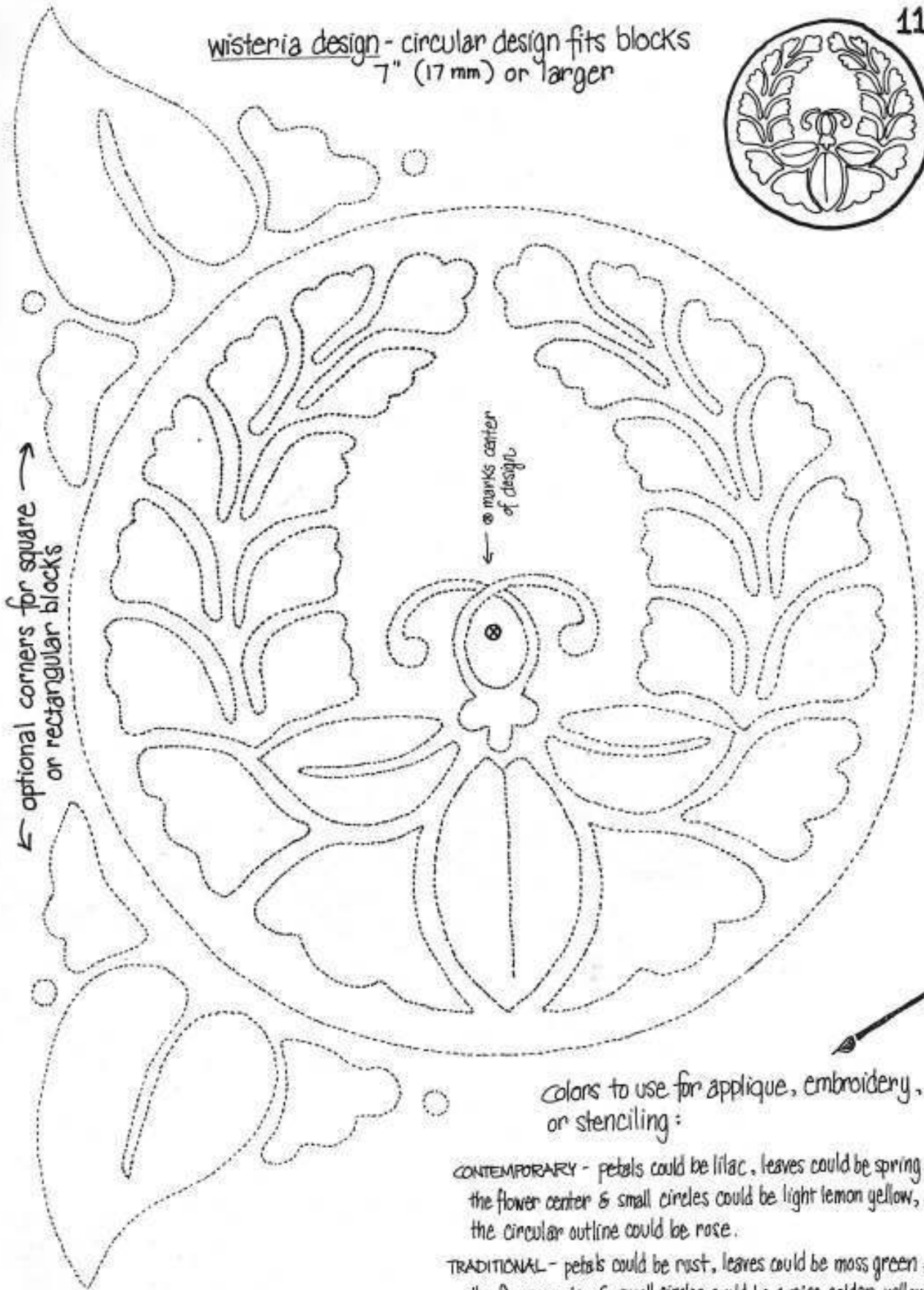
or the floral accent on page 17
and repeat them.



this would be especially nice
on a lampshade, or
embroidered on a pillow.
use pastels - lilac, baby
pink, spring green...

wisteria design - circular design fits blocks
7" (17 mm) or larger

colors to use for applique, embroidery,
or stenciling:

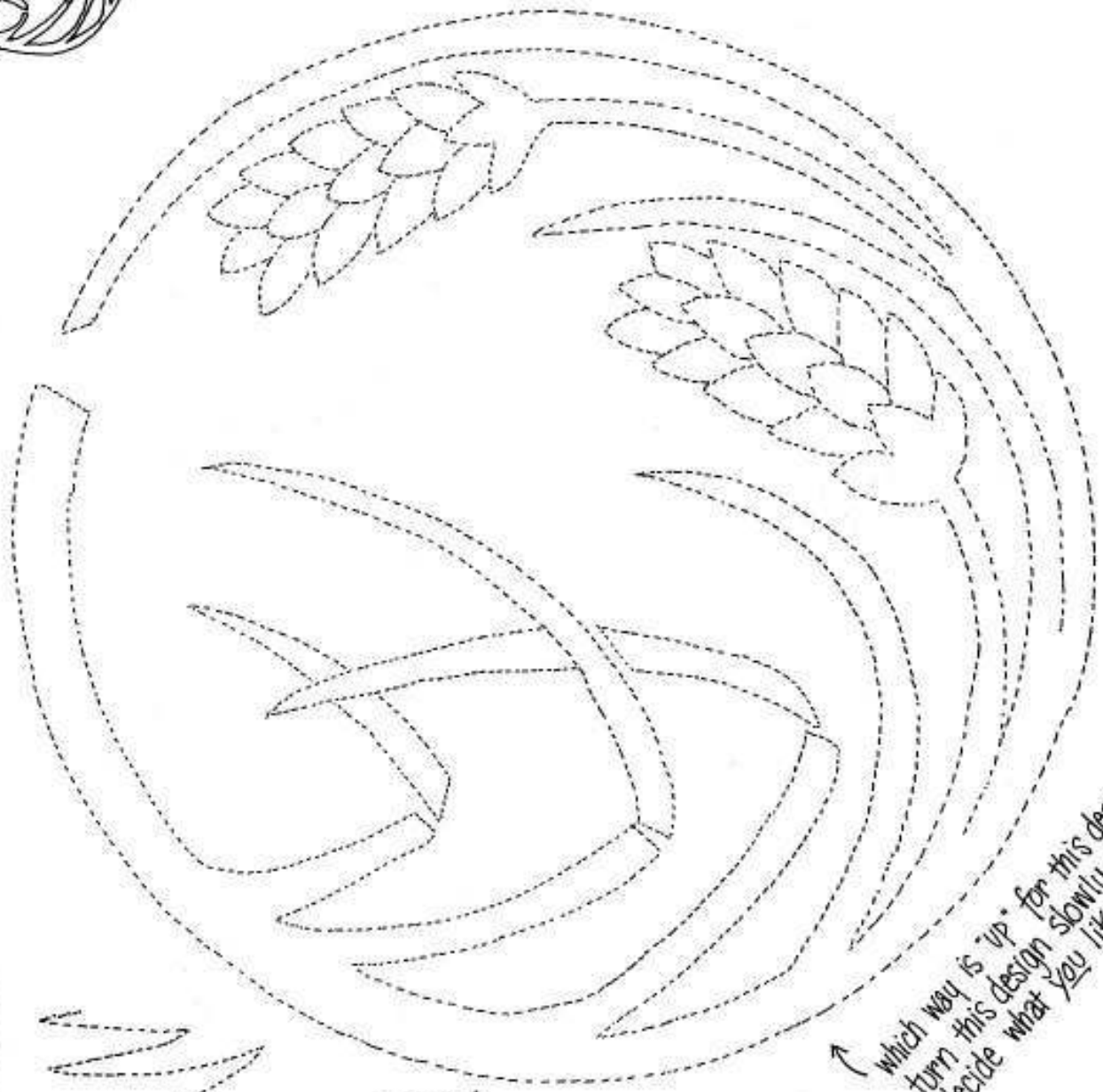
CONTEMPORARY - petals could be lilac, leaves could be spring green
the flower center & small circles could be light lemon yellow, and
the circular outline could be rose.

TRADITIONAL - petals could be rust, leaves could be moss green,
the flower center & small circles could be a nice golden yellow,
and the circular outline could be a burnt sienna brown.

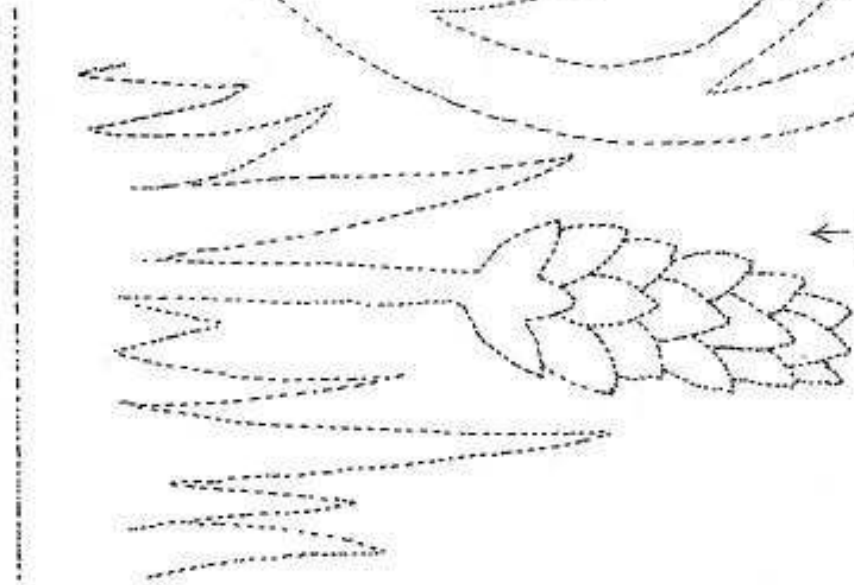

rice plant design- this design is
7" (18mm) wide



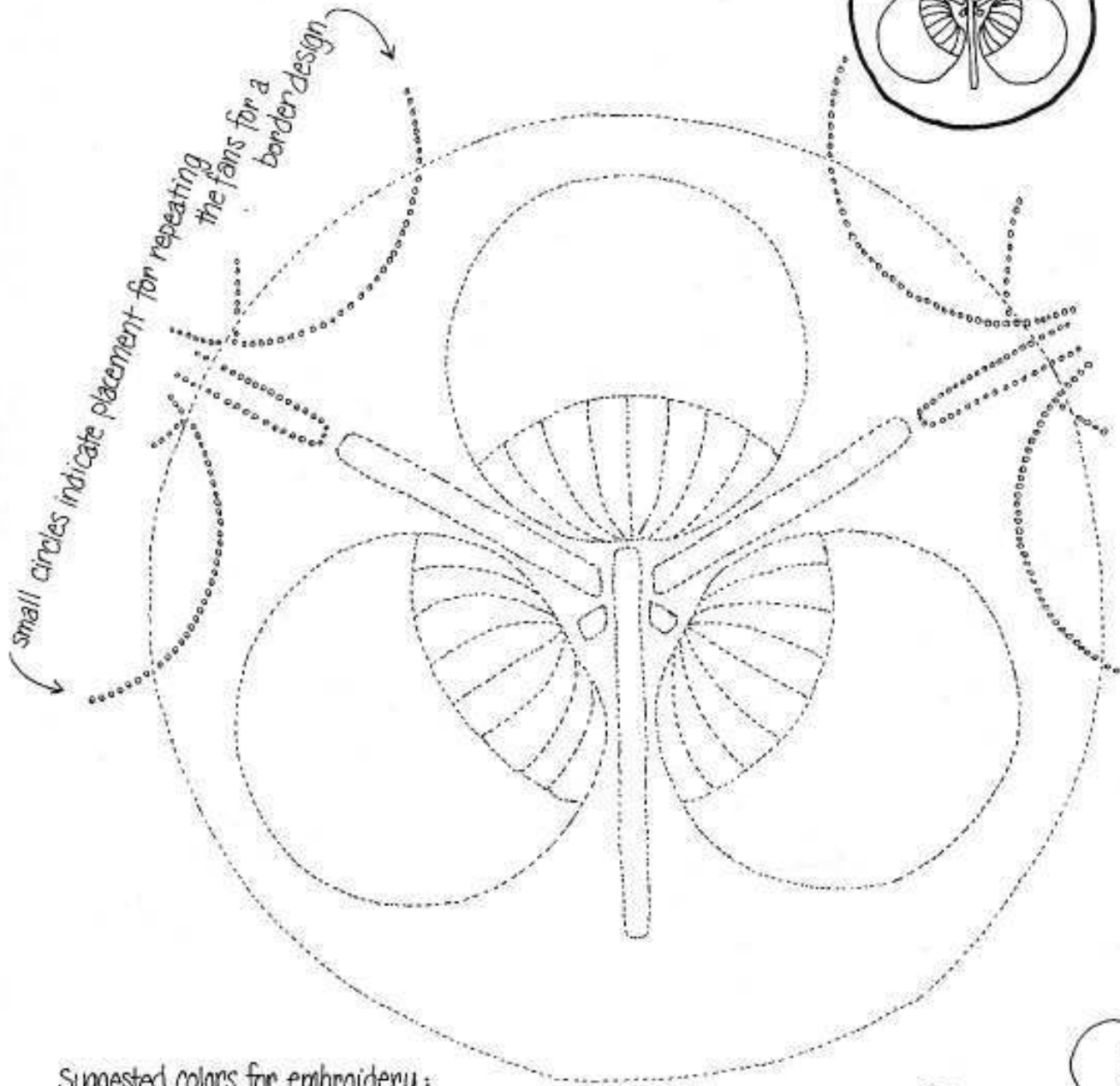
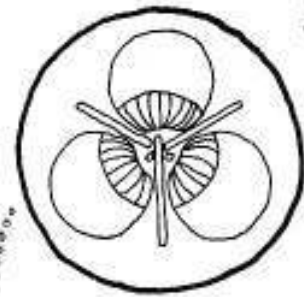
which way is 'up' for this design?

suggested colors for embroidery:
rice plants are green when
growing, so use a variety,
from spring green to moss
green.

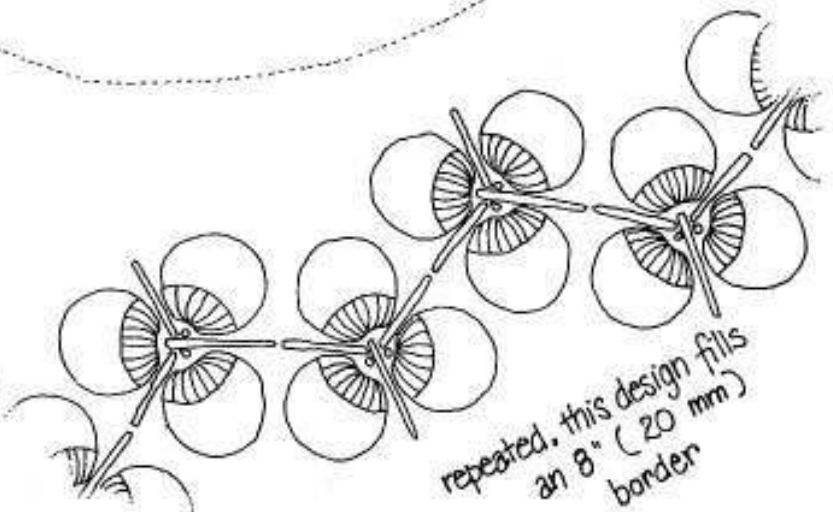
Japanese fan design - this circular design is 6 1/2" (16 mm) wide



Suggested colors for embroidery:
bright, Amish or Oriental colors -
turquoise, rust, golden yellow.

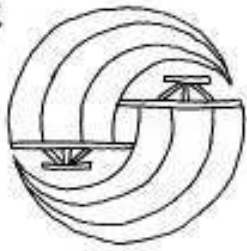


Stencil choices - instead of simply cutting for the lines, you could cut every second section of the fan.

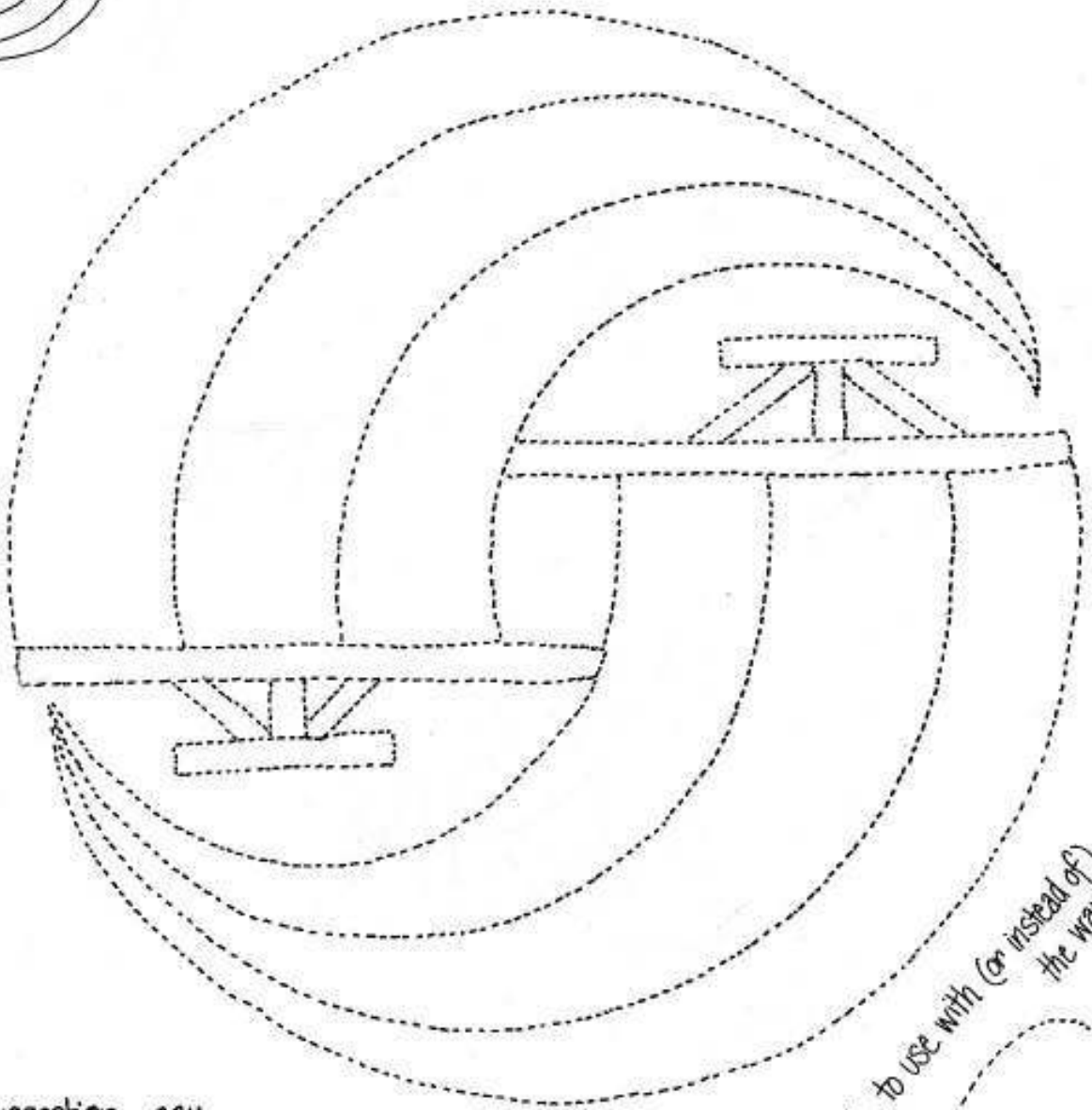


repeated, this design fills an 8" (20 mm) border

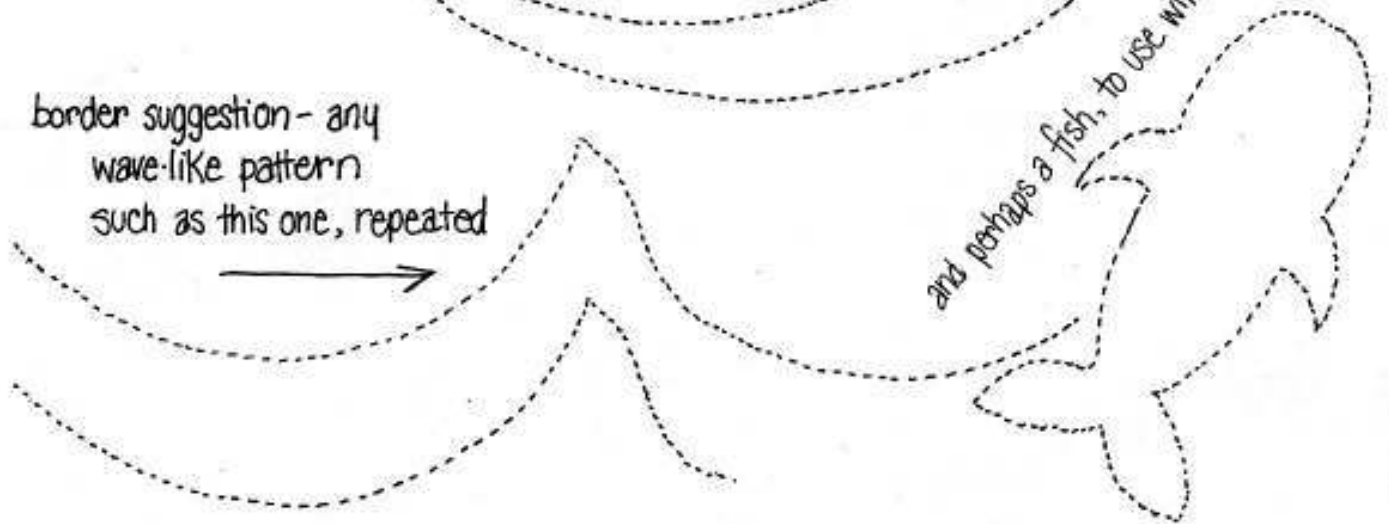
ships' sails - this is for blocks $7\frac{1}{4}$ " (18 mm) or larger



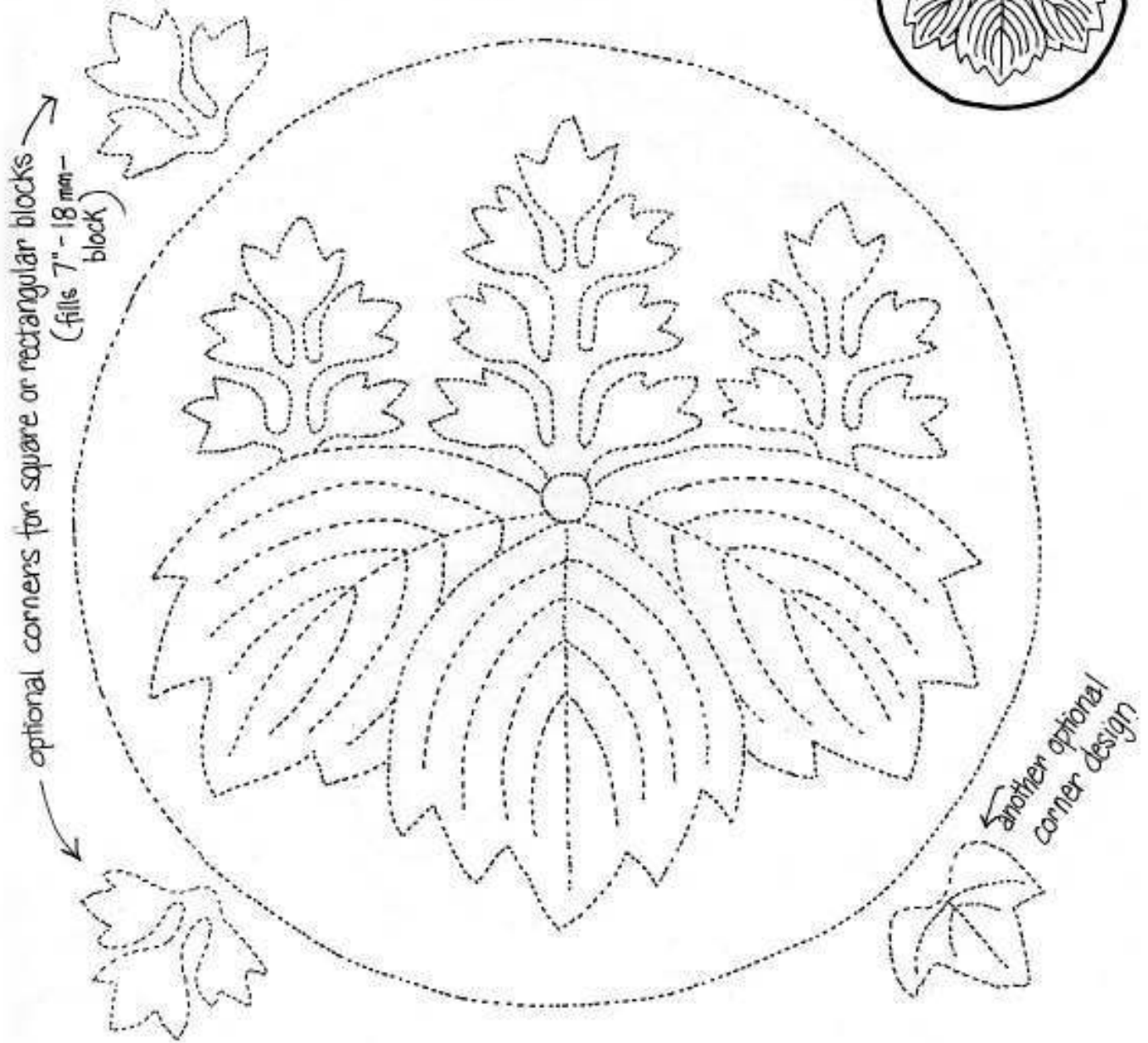
border suggestion - any wave-like pattern such as this one, repeated



and perhaps a fish, to use with (or instead of) the waves?

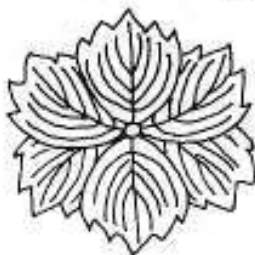


crest of the Empress - this design is 6 1/2" (16.5 mm) wide



border ideas: (all of these are approx. 6" - 14.5 mm - tall)

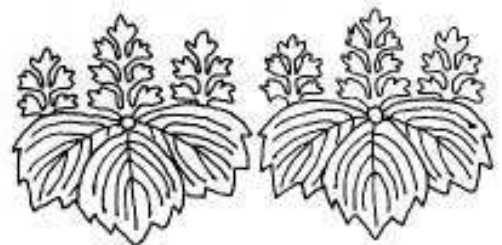

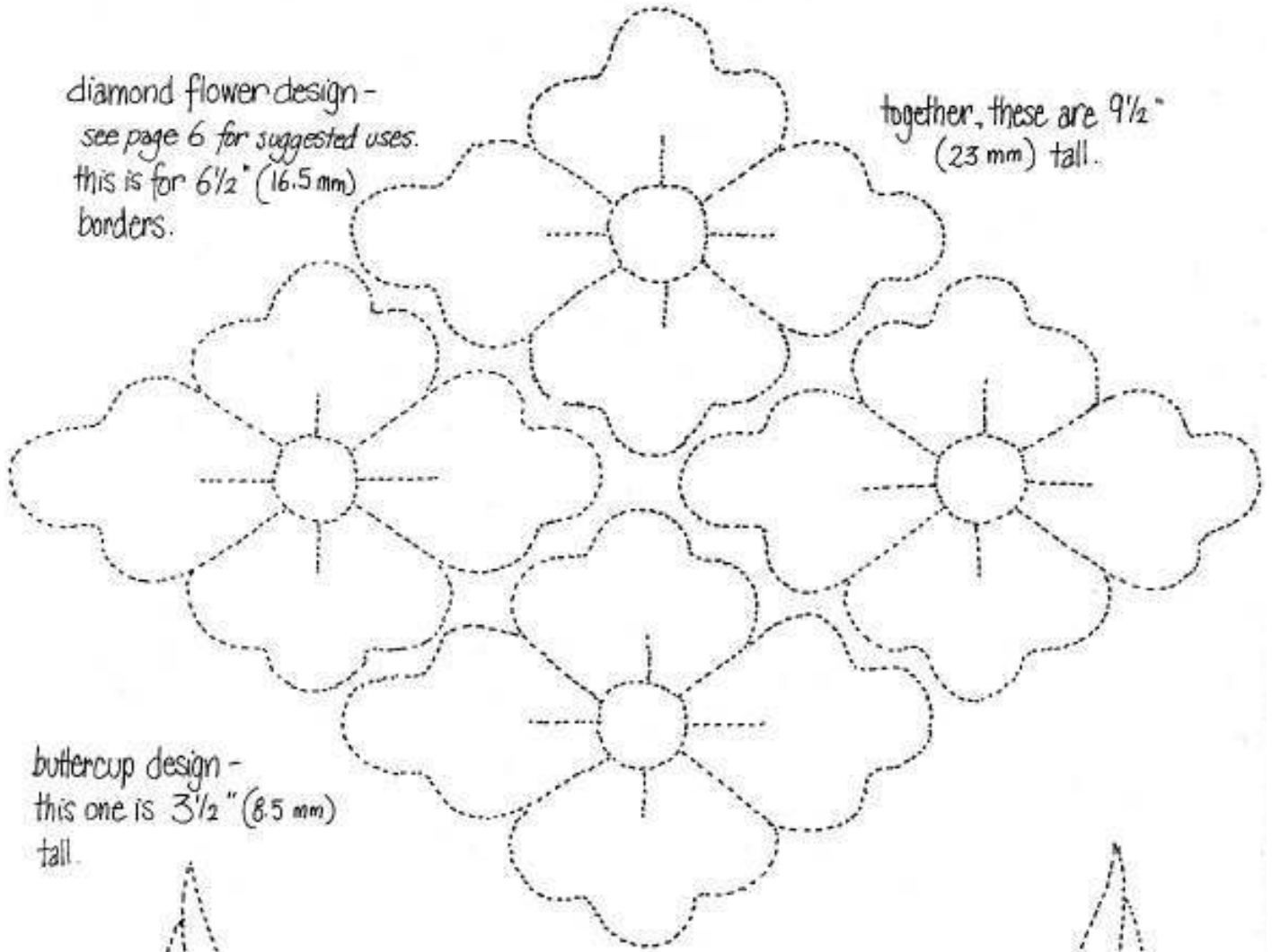

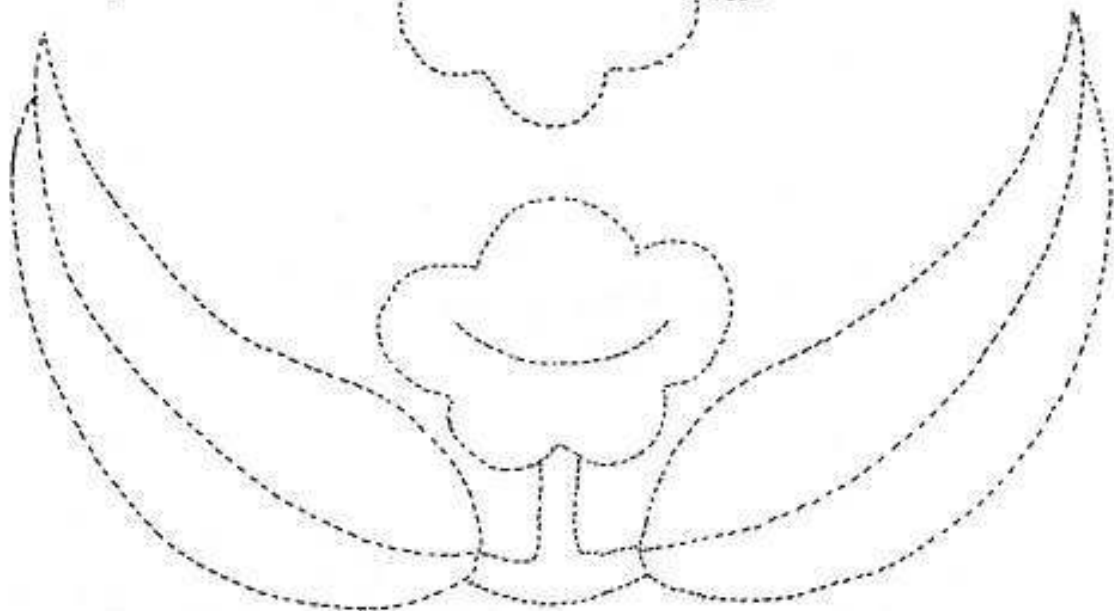

tall.

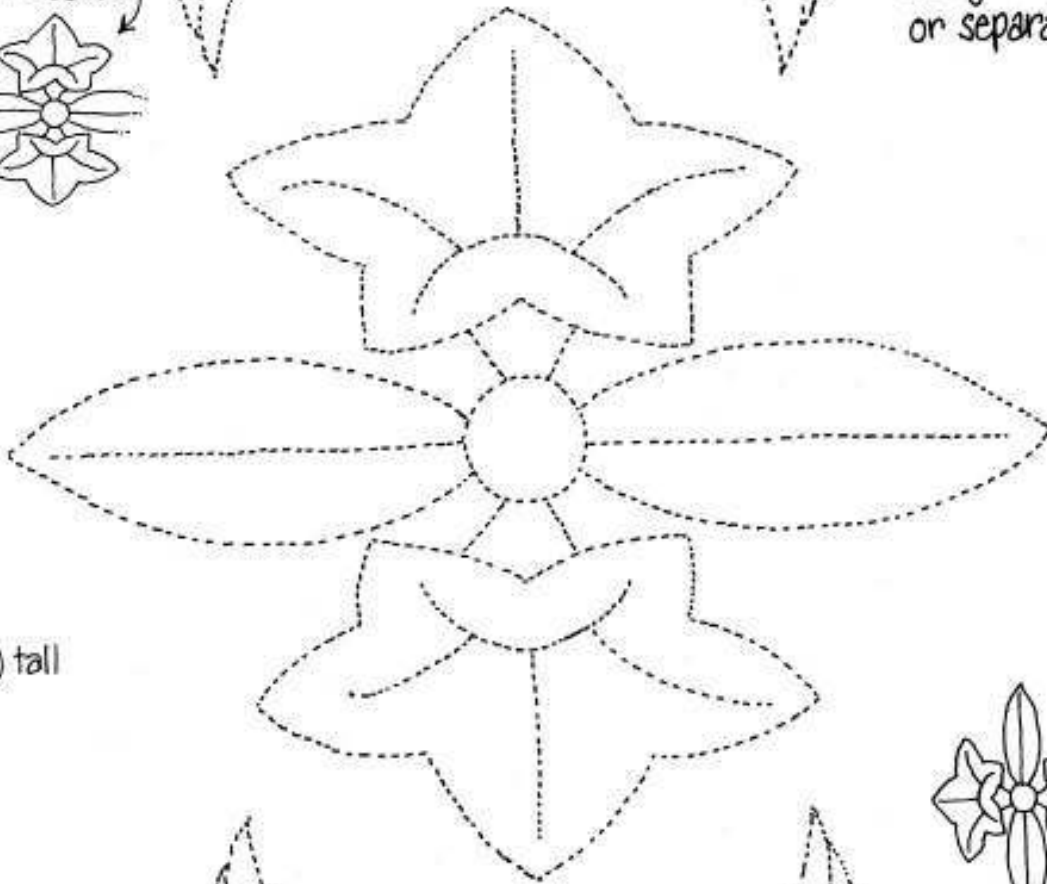
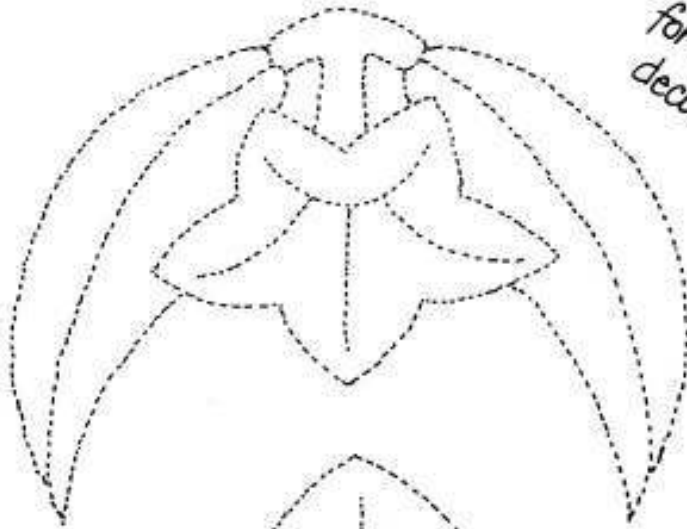
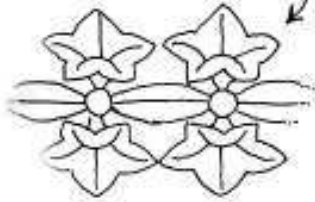

← diamond flower design - other copies of this design, in larger sizes, are on pages 6 & 16. see page 6 for ways to use this design. this one is exactly 3" (7.5 mm) tall.

poppy design - a larger copy of this design is on page 5. this one is 4½" (11.5 mm) wide.



← i don't have a name for this one, but it reminds me of a fleur-de-lis! repeat it this way, or turn it on its side and repeat it that way. it's 4" (10 mm) tall and 4½" (11.5 mm) wide.

HOW TO USE THIS BOOK...

these designs were drawn full-size, ready to use. you can trace them with a transfer pencil, or you can use plastic to trace & cut permanent stencils. i have my own method: i buy a fairly fine needlepoint canvas (canvas, not nylon or plastic) and trace the design onto the canvas with a permanent ink felt writer. then, i place the canvas on my quilt and use a "vanishing" or water-erasable marker so that the marks go through the holes in the needlepoint canvas, and appear on my quilt.

BE CREATIVE!

there are quilting designs all around you. perhaps you'll see a design in the roses growing up a chain-link fence. maybe you could make a repeat design, using the "golden arches" on the placemat at the local hamburger restaurant. jewelry, book covers, and quick-stop convenience stores (our local quick-stop has a sign with a *terrific* hen design!) can all provide ideas for designs... and this is just the beginning!

start looking - experiment - be creative - and have fun!
